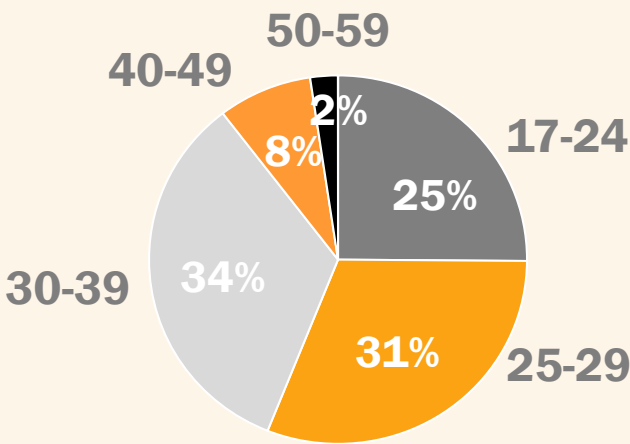

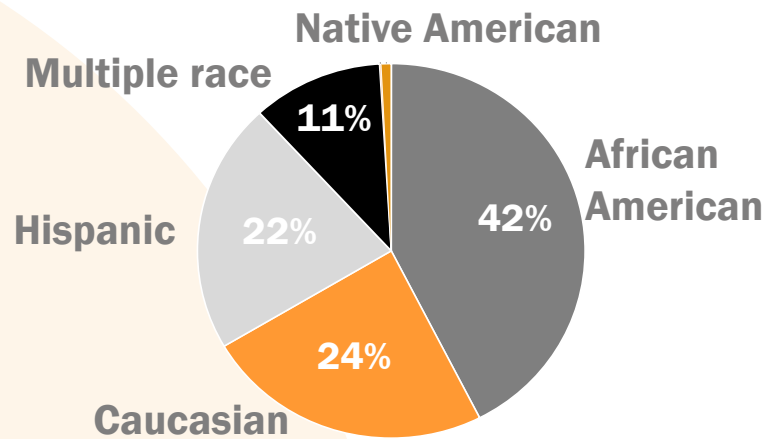
CWEE participants' most common barriers to success in FY17:

- 54% reported homelessness or unstable housing
- 43% reported past or current relationship abuse
- 21% reported unreliable child care, or none at all
- 16% reported a lack of personal support system

Age of Participants:

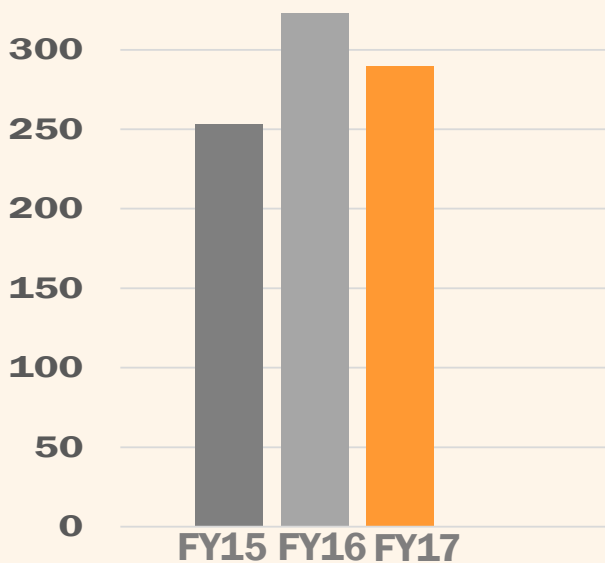


Ethnicity of Participants:
