


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Dear Friends,

When we take a moment to reflect on the past year, it is evident that it was one of great impact and growth for the Center for Work Education and Employment. Alongside you and our community of participants, staff, program partners, donors and volunteers, CWEE activated hope in the lives of more than 1,000 families this year. With your care and support, legacies of change are taking root in the lives of our families. Below you'll find just a few of the moments you helped make possible.

This year, we saw more participants on-site at CWEE than we have since the pandemic began. We made a thoughtful and intentional effort to expand our in-person program offerings this year, with great success. Our on-site attendance has increased by 537% this year! Welcoming more participants onsite, more often, has contributed to a richer community and greater programmatic outcomes.

As a result of increased on-site attendance and activity, we expanded our resources and supports available to participants when they are at CWEE. This year, we distributed more than 30,000 pounds of food through our Resource Room, hosted nearly 200 individuals to shop in our professional clothing boutique, and began offering drop-in labs to help participants build self-advocacy skills relating to housing, benefit navigation, and transportation.



The past year has shown us what's possible when our community comes together with shared purpose and compassion. WHAT WE DO

Programmatic Pillars

For more than 40 years, CWEE has supported low-income parents in the Metro-Denver community as they overcome significant barriers to securing and maintaining quality employment.

CWEE activates hope for low-income parents through three holistic programmatic pillars designed to help participants gain employment and exit generational poverty.



Foundational

During the Foundational Support phase, CWEE staff build relationships with and provide support to our collaborative goal setting to address areas of significant need identified by

Wellness

CWEE recognizes that personal wellness is essential for professional success. Wellness is at the center of our work and is infused in all program elements, from our traumainformed practices to our no-cost mental health services.

During their time with CWEE, participants also complete social-emotional learning alongside a cohort of other participants, where they learn skills such as stress and time



Education & Employment

CWEE's career-readiness programming provides personalized, hands-on career training so participants can job-search and interview with confidence and courage. Participants build digital skills for the workplace, create resumes and cover letters, take part in mock interviews, and receive oneon-one support with their iob search.

Throughout the program, CWEE staff help participants explore education options such as college, trade schools, and certificate programs.

FOUNDATIONAL

Achieving your goals begins with a strong foundation. Here are some of the ways CWEE is helping participants ensure they have everything they need to succeed:



Resource Room

CWEE's Resource Room is an essential support to hundreds of families each year. Here, CWEE parents can access fresh and shelf stable food to ensure their families won't go hungry. On average, essential resources such as food, diapers, and hygiene items each time they visit the Resource Room.



PA Coaching

During their time at CWEE, their Program Advisor (PA) to their motivation to make those goals happen. Professional Clothing Boutique

Through our boutique, CWEE provides professional clothing to participants at no cost to help them make a great first impression at their interview, and dress to impress once they've landed the job. The boutique offers everything our careerseekers need for a businesscasual wardrobe, from suits and shoes to dresses and



Essential Baby Gear

Thanks to our partnership with WeeCycle, CWEE is proud to offer essential baby gear to participants at no cost. Raising a family on a limited budget is not easy - we're here to help by providing car seats, cribs, baby clothing and more, all at no cost to participants.



Community Resources and Support

Program Advisors work closely with participants to understand the needs of the families they walk alongside and connect them to resources for long-term sustainability, such as childcare, housing, legal support, and more.

WELLNESS

We believe that personal well-being is the cornerstone for professional growth. Here's how we're ensuring participants have access to the supports they need to succeed professionally.



Social-Emotional Learning

Social-emotional learning (SEL) is an integral part of our workforce readiness training because it increases career seekers' confidence and personal management skills. SEL also helps participants recognize that change is possible, and provides the tools needed to make that change.

During their time at CWEE, participants have the opportunity to learn about and practice a wide variety of SEL topics, from emotional regulation strategies to time management.



Peer Support

This year, we launched bi-weekly peer support groups. Every other Wednesday, participants come together in community to discuss relevant topics and offer their own personal experiences. These lunches, led by CWEE's Social-Emotional Learning Facilitator, also result in resource exchanges, with participants sharing everything from where to get used tires to childcare and school recommendations.



Couples and Family Therapy

At CWEE, 100% of our participants are parents who are pursuing careers while meeting their family's needs. We know that parents' personal well-being is directly related to their families' wellness. This year CWEE began offering on-site family therapy services for the first time.

We were also proud to begin offering couples counseling for CWEE participants. We recognize that raising a family together is a big job, and we believe couples deserve the support they need to help them succeed. These expanded services are part of our commitment to multi-generational approaches to strengthening career seekers and their families alongside one another.



Bilingual Opportunities

Approximately 29% of our participants speak Spanish. We recognize the importance of being able to access mental health services in the language you are most comfortable with. CWEE has a bilingual therapist on staff to ensure accessible and culturally responsive care.

EMPLOYMENT & EDUCATION

Building a successful career begins with access to quality education and meaningful employment. Here's how CWEE is equipping participants with the tools and training they need to succeed in today's job market:



Career Readiness Program

This year, CWEE launched a new, four week in-person program that provides engaging and supportive classes to prepare participants for the job search process and future employment. Through CWEE's Career Readiness Program (CRP), participants receive individualized, comprehensive career coaching and training. Participants learn employmentrelated digital skills, write resumes and cover letters, participate in mock interviews, and receive individual job search support.



High School Equivalency

Earning a GED is not only a huge life milestone – it's an important step toward financial stability and greater competitiveness in the workplace. That's why CWEE offers GED preparation classes in a supportive environment at no cost to participants. We utilize a hybrid program model that meets students where they are so they can succeed in their educational goals. The results of this empowering approach were evident during the fiscal year as four CWEE participants earned their GED and 28 individual subject area exams were passed.



Employer Partners

Employer partners are an essential part of CWEE's program. They volunteer at events, complete resume reviews and mock interviews, provide quality employment opportunities for participants, and offer valuable insights that shape our programs. From wrapping gifts at Winter Wonderland, to hosting lunchand-learn events, and leading industry-learning workshops for participants, our employer partners invest in CWEE families all year long. This year, CWEE was proud to partner with 15 employer partners who spent a total of 30 hours investing in CWEE participants.

CWEE Alumni

For more than four decades, CWEE has been investing in the potential of low-income parents through holistic, comprehensive career-readiness training.

We're looking back on a legacy of 43 years by sharing the stories of some of CWEE's earliest alumni.



"Before coming to CWEE, I had no goals or direction. Since graduating from CWEE in September of 1982, I got my GED, went to school for electronics and completed radio repair and electronic test technician certification. I worked with Siemens Component, Inc., as an Assembler III for 8 months and have recently begun a new career with Xerox. I moved out of the housing projects and rent a place of my own. Since graduating from CWEE, everything I have wanted to accomplish has happened."


